

On the cover



This 50th anniversary art installation was forged by Okanagan artist Braden Kiefiuk and unveiled in October 2020. Each wolf is made up of hand-cut pieces of steel fur.

In Secwépemc oral history, the wolf—or “Mélemstye” Secwepemctsín—teaches people to hunt, and the important qualities a hunter needs to be successful: patience, vigilance, alertness and an understanding of the environment, among other things. The same qualities important for a successful student who, like the hunter, must devise a strategy to reach their end goal.

But to be a good teacher and pass on this knowledge, Mélemstye requires committed students. So it's fitting that these three wolves join Skéléd (Coyote), a teacher in his own right, on the TRU campus on the traditional lands of the Tk’emlúps te Secwépemc.



TRU is proud to be the “University of Choice” hosting the highest numbers of Indigenous students of any BC post-secondary with 11% at the Kamloops campus, 28% Williams Lake campus and 7% Open Learning. The TRU service area also includes the St’át’imc, Nlaka’pamux, Nuxalk, Tsilhqot’in, Dakelh, and Syilx nations.



The Indigenous Education image shows Skéléd (Creator, Trickster, teacher) on his educational journey at TRU. This image is synonymous with Indigenization and represents working in partnership and supporting one another.

Meaning of colours in the image:

Dark blue represents Séwllkwe (Water)
Green represents Specéc (Air)
Brown represents the Tmicw (Land)
Orange represents the Skwékw7es (Sun)
Yellow represents the Mégcen (Moon)
