PRE-ADMISSION GUIDELINES DENTAL HYGIENE

Applicants interested in a Dental Hygiene Program (see page two) must complete one full year of university coursework (30 credits) prior to applying for admission at their institution of choice.

Please be aware that the number of applicants to Dental Hygiene often exceeds the total number of available spaces. Therefore, the recommendation is that **students have a second academic/career goal** in mind.

Program requirements are subject to change annually:

- Students must review up-to-date program information within each institution's calendar and Dental Hygiene website, to confirm the application process, course requirements, volunteer or paid experience, and any additional requirements needed to be admitted.
- Potential applicants should note the **competitive** GPA recommended at each institution for admission and be aware that the minimum grade at each institution may differ.
- Course transfers should be checked using the online transfer guide at https://www.bctransferguide.ca/ for BC applicants and sent to each institution by their stated deadlines.

The following TRU courses are recommended for application and can be taken in one of the following programs: Exploratory Studies, the Bachelor of Science or the Bachelor of Arts.
